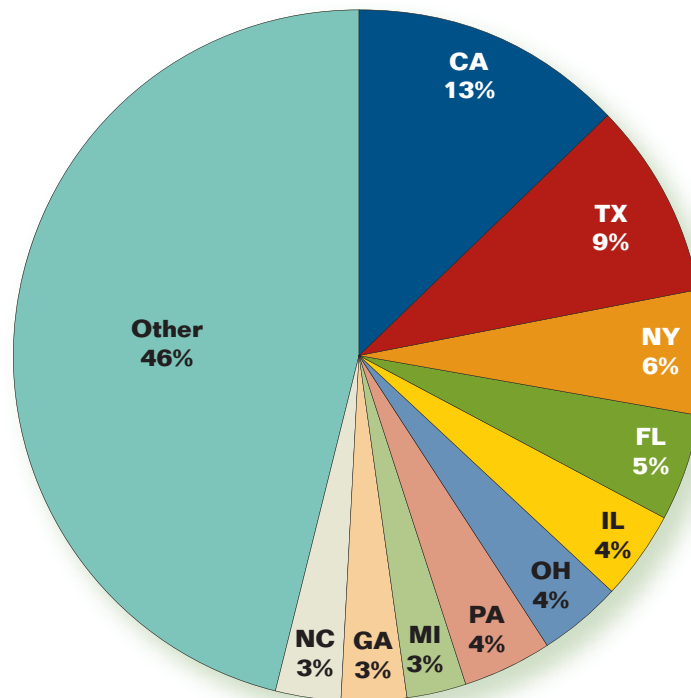

Enrollment Comparison Report 2006-2007

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to quantify year-to-year changes in K-12 public school enrollments at the national, state, and county levels for the 2006-2007 school year. Public school enrollment figures, compiled by MDR, show that the total K-12 student population of 48.2 million increased by 414,927 students for the 2006-2007 school year compared with the prior (2005-2006) school year, resulting in an increase of .87%. In terms of milestones, California still leads the pack with over 6.2 million students. Texas passed the 4.5 million student mark and is still growing much faster (+2.29%) than the national average growth rate. Florida, with over 2.2 million students, also had a higher-than-average growth rate of +1.05%. The top ten enrollment states comprise 54% of total national enrollment.

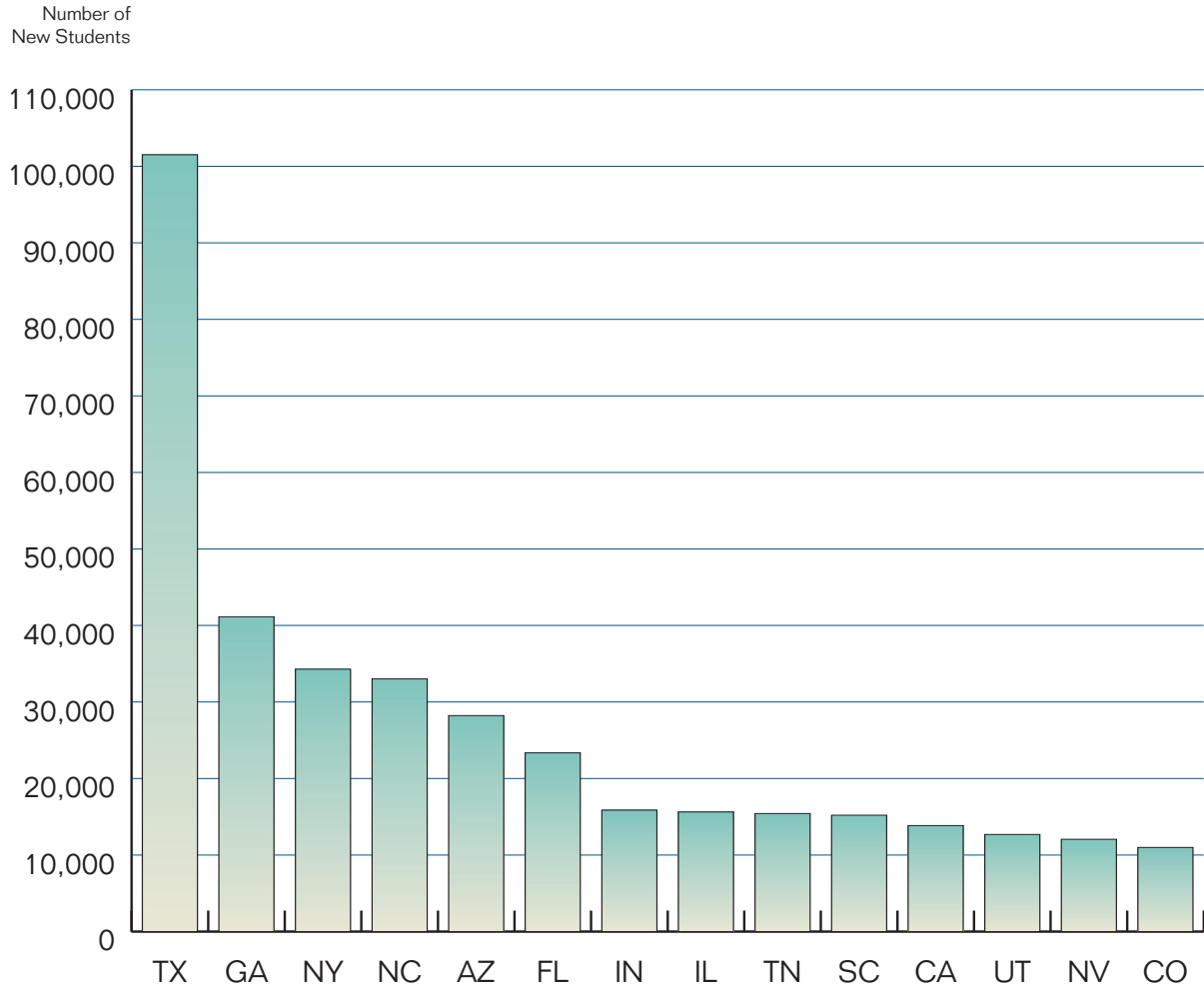
Top Ten Enrollment States as a Percentage of Total Enrollment



For school marketers interested in focusing their efforts on the fastest-growing geographic areas, it is useful to note that much of the recent enrollment growth has been contained within relatively few states and counties. Looking at the fastest-growing states for 2006-2007, based on biggest year-to-year gains in total number of students, Texas (+101,506) tops the list, followed by Georgia (+41,141), then New York (+34,284), North Carolina (+33,025), Arizona (+28,221), and Florida (+23,353), all with increases of 23,000 or more students. On a percentage gain basis, Nevada continues to be the fastest-growing state with a +2.93% year-to-year gain in 2006-2007, more than three times the national average growth rate.

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In fact, 42.7% of the total rise in this year's student enrollment is contained just within the top three growth states of Texas, Georgia, and New York. The following chart shows the 14 fastest-growing states in 2006-2007, each with a gain of at least 10,000 students:

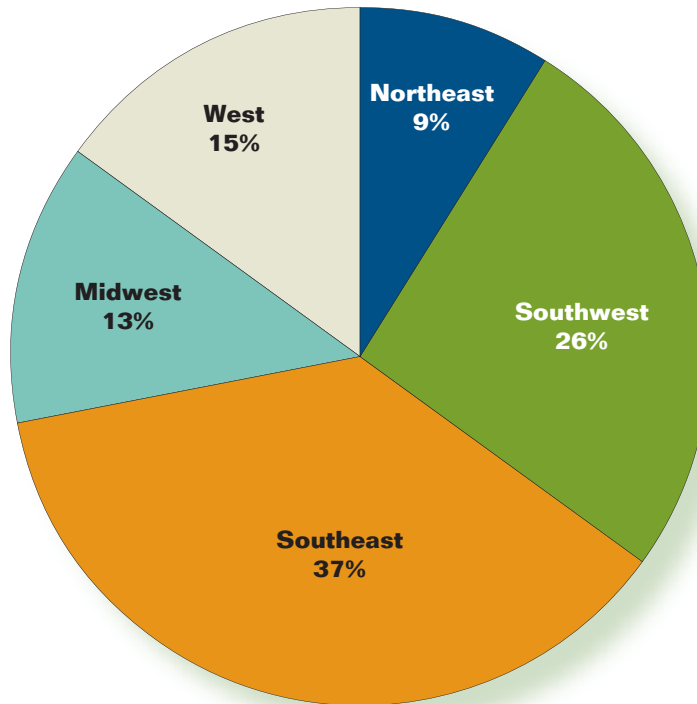


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REGIONAL VARIATIONS

At the regional level, the Southeast contributed the most to the national enrollment gain, fueled primarily by Georgia, North Carolina, and Florida, with an increase of 151,471 students (36.5% of national total). Ten of the twelve states in the Southeast had year-to-year enrollment gains. The Southwest region ranked second in growth, thanks in large measure to strong gains in Texas and Arizona, with an increase of 106,486 students (25.7% of national total). Seven of the eight Southwest states were up in 2006-2007. The West added 62,706 students (15.1% of national total), and the Midwest increased by 55,233 students (13.3% of national total). The Northeast was the laggard with six of the ten states losing enrollments, but due to relatively strong growth in New York, the region as a whole was still up 39,031 students (9.4% of national total).

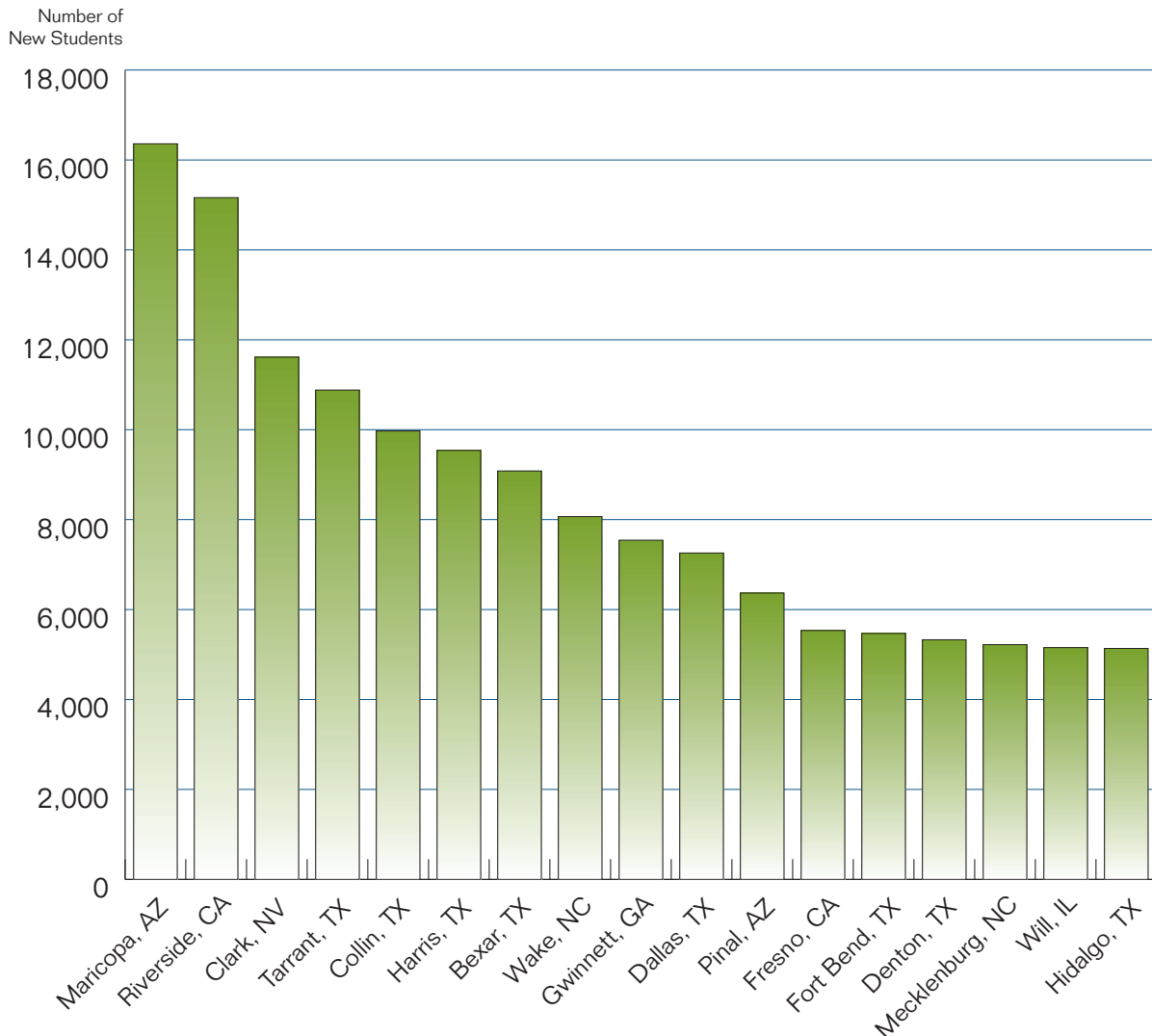

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Fastest-Growing Counties

Drilling down to the local level, the fastest-growing counties are heavily concentrated in the 14 fastest-growing states. In fact, all of the 17 counties with the biggest year-to-year gains in total student enrollment (5,000 students or more) can be found within the 14 fastest-growing states. As one would expect, Texas leads the list with 8 of the 17 fastest-growing counties, followed by Arizona with 2; California with 2; North Carolina with 2; and Georgia, Nevada, and Illinois with 1 each. Maricopa County in Arizona increased by over 16,000 students in 2006-2007, which is more than the increase in all but six of the fastest-growing states. Of the counties with increases of 5,000 or more students, Pinal County in Arizona recorded the largest percentage increase, a whopping 18.44%, followed by Collin County in Texas (up 7.87%) and Wake County in North Carolina (up 6.70%). The following chart is a ranked list of the 17 fastest-growing counties, each with year-to-year enrollment growth of more than 5,000 students.

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HISTORICAL ENROLLMENT TRENDS

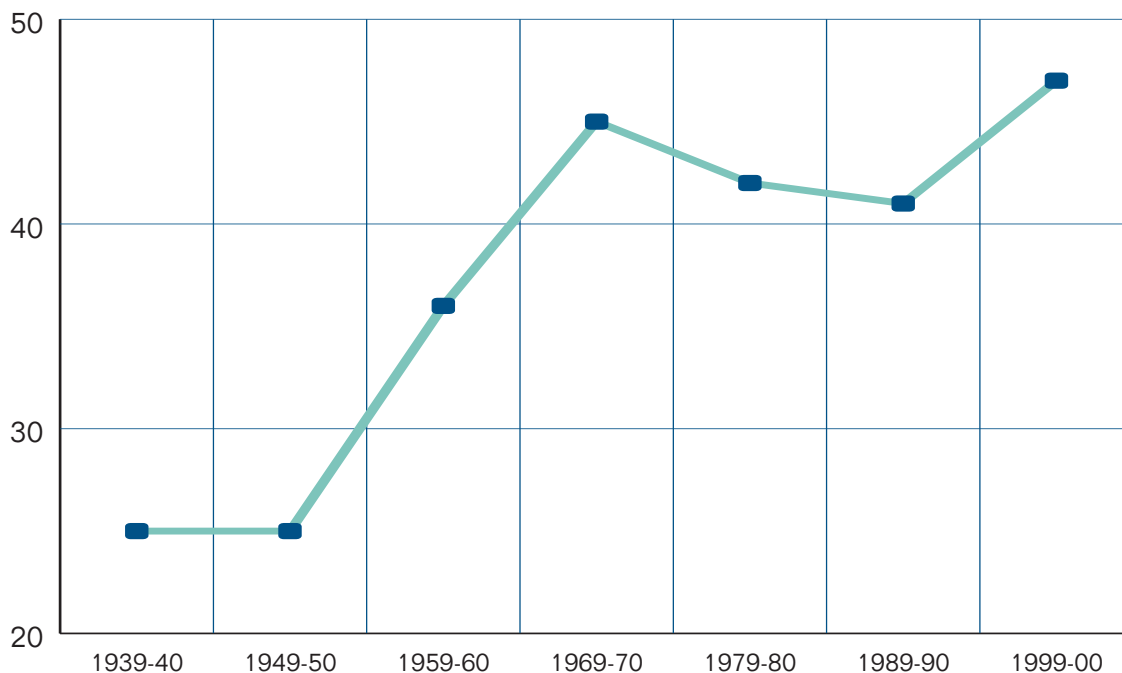
In recent years, slow and steady enrollment growth has been expected, and in fact, the national total has inched ahead virtually every year since 1990. But it hasn't always been that way, according to enrollment trends recorded by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES). Looking at enrollment statistics stretching all the way back to the 1930s and 1940s provides a picture of rapid growth throughout the 1950s and 1960s, followed by steep declines in the 1970s and 1980s and then by a surge of growth from the 1990s up to the present day.

In the decades of the 1930s, 1940s, and up to 1950, total enrollment in elementary and secondary schools was steady at around 25 million students. However, by the 1959-1960 school year, the national total had increased to just over 36 million, a strong 44% rise. Ten years later, in 1969-1970, the total had jumped again to a record breaking 45.6 million, an increase of another 26%. By 1979-1980, total enrollment had fallen from the 1969-1970 high point of 45.6 million to around 41.7 million, a drop of nearly four million students, or nearly 9%. By 1989-1990, the national total was down to 40.5 million, a decline of another 1.2 million students.

From the low point of 40.5 million in 1989-1990, K-12 enrollments rebounded to 46.9 million in 1999-2000, exceeding the high watermark established back in 1969-1970. The following table shows total enrollment in elementary and secondary schools, according to NCES, for selected school years from 1939-1940 through 1999-2000.

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Enrollments From 1990 Through 2006

With such significant enrollment swings observed in the years prior to 1990, it is a relief to note that since 1990 enrollments have moved in only one direction: up. According to NCES, public K-12 enrollment started at 41.2 million in 1990, and it increased every year (with the minor exception of 2004) leading to a 2006 total of 48.6 million. However, the growth pattern indicates stronger year-to-year growth from 1990 through 1997 compared with 1998 through 2006. From 1990 to 1997, the growth rate was above 1.1% every year, with a high of 2% growth in 1991. From 1998 to 2006, only one year, 2002, recorded growth as high as 1.1%, while 2004 was actually a down year (-0.6%).

Enrollment Projections Through 2015

Just as student enrollments in K-12 have been on the rise since 1990, NCES projects that they will continue to increase every year through 2015. As a function of a continued high birth rate in the U.S., total enrollments are expected to pass 49 million in 2007-2008, to top 50 million in 2013-2014, and to hit 51.2 million in 2015-2016. If U.S. immigration policies become more liberal as time goes on, there is a strong possibility that even these healthy growth projections will prove to be far too conservative.

Contained in the body of this report is a series of data tables pinpointing the year-to-year enrollment changes nationally, by state, and by county, enabling the reader to investigate gains and losses of student population on a national scale, in a particular region of the country, and/or in individual states and counties. The first table presents an overview of the states in alphabetical order. The second table ranks the states from highest to lowest enrollment gains/losses in terms of number of students, while the third table ranks state-by-state gains/losses on a percentage basis. The fourth table examines the county level, ranking enrollment gains/losses in terms of number of students. The fifth and final table shows county enrollment changes arranged in descending order of variance within each state. All of the figures in this report reflect public school enrollments.
